How it all started

Early/mid 90's:

- >The trade wanted to reduce waste
- >The industry wanted more cost effective packaging
- ➤ One-way cartons often poor quality waste of goods
- > Decision on joint venture industry/trade
- >SRS founded as a project 1996

Late 90's:

- ➤ Technical cross-functional groups gathering information
- > Evaluation of products and suppliers of RTPs
- > Evaluation of existing systems
- > Specifications determined
- >SRS in operation Feb 01, 1999
- First washing plant built, opened Nov 2000

Key idea – uniqueness?

Standardization:

- >Same RTPs regardless of retail chain
- Same RTPs for different industries:

 meat
 cheese
 fruit & vegetables
- **≻**Centralized return logistics
- **≻One nationwide pool operator**



Background

Three major benefits:

- **≻**Cost
- > Handling
- **Environment**



Cost effectiveness

- > Reduced purchasing cost wrapping material
- > Reduced waste of goods
- ➤ More effective handling throughout the supply chain
- **➤ Non profit-maximizing company**



Effective handling

- Frequent deliveries reduced stock of wrapping material
- ➤ Ready to use no assembling of cartons
- Quick and easy when unpacking
- ➢Increased hygiene no carton dust or wooden particles
- ➤ No waste to take care of
- >Crates totally compatible
- >Adapted for automation



Environment

- ➤ An open deposit-based system minimizes the number of RTPs in circulation
- >Effective utilization of transport units
- > Reduces the waste mountain
- Working environment improved
- >Appointed by EU LIFE fund



Environment, cont'd

- **≻**Comparison to one-way cardboard
 - -RTPs require 39 % less energy
 - -RTPs produce 95 % less waste
 - -RTPs generete 29 % less green house emissions*



Environment cont'd

- >RTPs are more environmental friendly
 - as the material used for producing cardboard, stable and moist resistant enough, have very complex production processes being much more harmful to the environment**.














System design

- ➤ Deposit = security
- **≻User Fee**
 - **>** distribution
 - >return logistics
 - **>** washing
 - >over head costs
 - >financing
- >All transportation handled by external hauliers

- **>4** = Gothenburg
- >Locations to minimize transport mileage






Market development

- **≻2001:** first full year in operation
- >Fresh produce, first category to convert
- **≻**Processed meat, poultry followed
- >Cheese followed
- >2005: All major players contracted
- > Rapidly increasing export volumes

New plastic pallet

- **≻**Generation 2 pallets initiated
- > New technical specification
 - reduced weight 15 kg
 - > increased friction
 - > easy to handle
- **≻**Launch beginning of 2009


